Health Care Services – Allied Health Professionals	Allied health professionals includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Physiotherapy ○ Speech and language therapy ○ Occupational therapy ○ Dietetics 			
Health Care Services – Multidisciplinary Team Working	Multidisciplinary team working includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ How services work together ○ Referrals between services 			
Social Care	A range of social care needs: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Help with day-to-day living because of illness ○ Vulnerability or disability
