

Dear Students/Parents/Guardians,

Year 13 - End of Year Arrangements and Information

We are writing to outline some important information as we enter the final few weeks of teaching with Year 13 students. We know our Year 13 students experienced some disruption during their earlier years at school, but we are so pleased with the resilience they have shown and are looking forward to seeing them step-up and strive towards success over the final few weeks of their A-levels studies.

A-level examinations start on Monday, 13 May 2024 and during this initial week of exams we expect all Year 13 students to be in school and attending lessons full time when they are not in an examination. This is to maximise the time students have with staff for focused and guided revision/examination preparation.

Our final day of compulsory attendance and formal teaching for Year 13 will be <u>Friday, 17 May</u>, after which students will be released on study leave. During this period, teaching staff may request attendance of students for teaching/revision sessions in their subjects and where this is the case, we would expect students to attend. Staff will also be available via MSTeams for support during the week leading up to half term (20-24 May).

Our Year 13 Leavers Assembly will take place on Friday, 17 May 2024 during Period 3/4 with students departing immediately after this. This is an opportunity for students to reminisce and to say goodbye to fellow students and staff.

A-level results day for this academic year is scheduled for Thursday, 15 August and will be held onsite; arrangements for the day will be communicated in due course. On the day key staff will be available to offer support and guidance on next steps.
